Minutes from April 16, 2024 Meeting

Welcome: Linda Mitchell welcomed all members, including one new member, three guests, and members on Zoom.

Announcements: The 2024 Fall Quilt Retreat dates were announced and will be October 23, 2024 - October 27, 2024. Please see Babette Sutherland for the registration form.

- Kathie Haney provided the quarterly treasurer's report to the guild.
- Lisa Lombardo demonstrated the Accuquilt system and provided additional information about the dies.

BOM: There is no BOM program for 2024 so that members can prepare for the 2024 Quilt Show in October.

Membership: One new member joined the guild, Cynthia Brennan.

Comfort Quilts: Maxine Close mentioned that there were 58 comfort quilts collected in March, for a total of 68 so far this year. 51 surgery dolls were also collected in March, for a total of 58 so far this year. The winner of the Comfort Quilt drawing was Laura Chaplar.

Workshops: The April workshop will be Comfort Quilts and Dignity Bibs. The May workshop will be Quilted Jackets with Barb Jones. There will also be a pattern for a tote bag to use up the leftover squares. The June workshop will be the SAM (Stash-buster Accuquilt Mystery) Workshop with Beth Mancini. The studio Accuquilt cutter will be set up during other workshops for members to cut their fabrics in advance.

50/50 Drawing: Mary Larkin won the 50/50 drawing this month.

Door prizes: Gail Forster and Tracy Klinger won the door prizes this month.

Program: This month the program featured Mary Koval who is an expert in antique quilts and fabrics. She has a store and retreat center in Bedford, Pennsylvania and has been quilting since 1970 with multiple published books and articles in quilting magazines. She spoke about the design process for creating reproduction fabrics, specializing in pieces from 1840-1900. She has a collection of over 100,000 pieces of antique fabrics and has created over 50 collections with various fabric companies. A trunk show/sale followed her presentation.

Spotlight on a Quilt Shop - Seamless Sewing Arts



Seamless Sewing Arts in the Barn at Maple Lawn Village, 546 Kimberton Rd Phoenixville, Pa is a modern quilt shop. The phone number is 484 920-8971 and the website is www.SeamlessSewingArts.com. There is also a social media presence at seamlesssewingarts on Facebook and @seamlesssewingarts on Instagram. You can also look for their online store.

Although there is no discount given to guild members, you can take advantage of the many specials and sales that are offered. Additionally, look for the terrific selections of clearance fabrics for up to 50% off.

Seamless is "all modern, all the time" specializing in bringing contemporary, cutting edge fabric designs to their customers. However, they seek out good design regardless of popular definition and have some fabrics in more traditional vein as well including lines like Tilda and Mid-Century designers such as Charley Harper. Denise says the focus is always on exceptional design—end of subject!

In addition to the fabrics, Seamless offers longarm quilting service both computerized edge to edge and custom free motion quilting. In spite of being modern, there is also a unique-for-this-area collection of vintage Singer Featherweight sewing machines. The store carries fully reconditioned Singer 221 machines as well as accessories and maintenance supplies. Denise teaches classes to help you make the upkeep of these wonderful machines easy. You can also get your Featherweight serviced there if you prefer not to do it yourself.

There is an educational program at Seamless Sewing Arts that aims to instill a love of sewing and a range of skills in current and future generations of sewists. To that end a skill-building curriculum for kids and teens for 10-17 years of age is offered. Homeschoolers will find classes also. The adult sewing curriculum starts with beginning apparel sewing, piecing, quilting, and bag-making. Occasionally home décor is also available. The full course catalog is at the website. There is a focus on multi-class courses rather than one-off projects which allows for better development of new and more complex skills.

Keep an eye out for Seamless to be participating in a variety of special events on a regular basis. Included are shop hops, First Friday events, Quilt Shop Day, and Super Bowl. They also vend at Brandywine Quilters Show, PA National Quilt Extravaganza (Oaks Show) and others. The first Wednesday of the month they have an Open Studio from 4-7pm. The \$10 fee for this can be applied to same-day purchases. Register for this online as space is limited.

There is a lot on offer at Seamless Sewing so stop on in if you are nearby.




