### Block of the Month

The new year is fast approaching so it is time to start a new Block of the Month project. This year's project is a little different than most. Instead of making one block every month and then joining them to make a quilt, this year's project involves making a mini quilt every month. Plus there is a background quilt to hold the mini quilts. #### Project

The mini quilt will be our monthly block and the background quilt is an extra project. To be entered in the monthly drawing for a prize you have to finish the mini quilt. There will be an extra drawing for those who have their mini quilt quilted and bound.

#### Fabric & Supplies

It is hard to estimate fabric requirements for this project and the book provides minimal information. I bought ½ yard cuts of approximately 15 coordinating fabrics and 3 yards of a neutral background fabric. I think this, plus scraps I already had will get me through the project. We shall see! The other things I used were a pack of Carol Doak's Foundation Papers and Misty Fuse, a great fusible for stitching through. The foundation paper comes 100 sheets per pack and I used about half, so you could share a pack with

someone. Misty Fuse is a little tricky to use, but it doesn't gunk up your needle or rip the thread when stitching through, so I think it's worth it!

#### January's Project

January's project features a snowman. Mr. Snowman can be hand or machine appliquéd or fused fast like I did. He can be cotton, wool, or flannel for a fuzzy look. Use your imagination to make him uniquely yours.

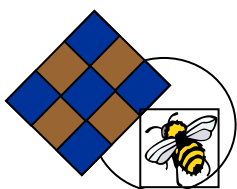

## 2012 Challenge—Silver Celebration

Silver can be shiny, sparkly, or gray. It must be 25% of your quilt. Now might be a good time to check out the silver fabrics in your favorite quilt shops! Sue 19038.

Use any design or pattern, original or commercially available and any construction technique. You may piece, appliqué, embroider, cross-stitch, paint, or embellish it.

Your quilt should be no larger than 50" on any given side. It may be any quilted item (quilt, jacket, bag, etc.). Your quilt should be something made during the coming year (October 2011 to September 2012).

## February Meeting Preview – 2/21/2012

It's the Members' Fabric Sale with a Twist! Clear out your unwanted fabric from your stash—fabrics you liked when purchased them, but that you now know are probably not going to be used. Included in the sale are any quilting books you may want to part with, completed tops or orphan blocks, along with any tools and gadgets. And remember—one quilter's stash-trash is another quilter's treasure. So whether you're bringing fabric to sell or not, come prepared with cash for those treasures you're sure to find!

Here are the guidelines:

- You, the seller, will be your own cashier. (That's the twist.) Bring your own cash box so that you can make change if necessary. Decide if you will accept checks.
- You set the price.

Each piece of fabric, "package" of fabrics, orphan blocks or quilting books must be clearly labeled with:

- Your name
- Price you are asking
- Yardage or size of fabric if appropriate

Order a full table or half table by calling Chris Candello by Saturday, February 18th, if you plan to sell some of your treasures. Since we have to plan the set-up in advance, only members registered will be given table space. Be selective in what you bring to sell because it must fit in the space provided on the table or under it.

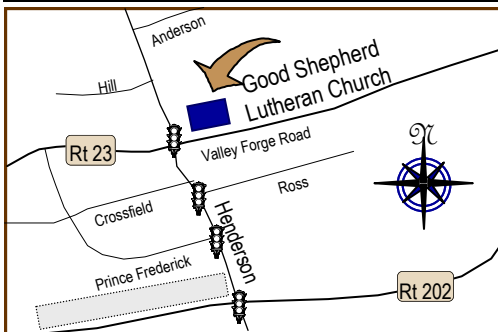
Buyers need to pay by cash or check. Bring your own shopping bag to take home your purchases.
