I am really looking forward to seeing everyone's creations for the paint chip challenge this month. You still have time to join in on this if you hurry.

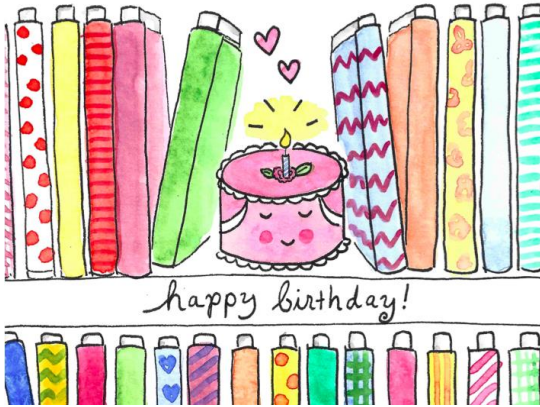

Jacque Paltrinieri will have a demo on English Paper Piecing

Supply list for English paper-piecing lesson:

fabric - 2 or 3 FQ **or** a dozen scraps bigger than 3 inches

thread to match

hand sewing needle,

straight pins or fabric clips

6 index cards

small piece of template plastic

glue stick

pencil and fabric marker

scissors (one for paper, one for fabric).

Supply list for jelly roll race:

Sewing machine that has been cleaned, in working order, and threaded

2 full bobbins of thread

Sharp fabric scissors

20 strips of fabric 2.5" x. Width of Fabric, that you cut at home and roll up

OR pull out 20 strips from a full-size jelly roll, roll up

OR store bought 1/2 roll (contains 20 x WOF strips) keep rolled up

Basket for sewn strips to keep off floor.

Binder clip

Race will be after lunch and should take 1 hour plus depending on speed.

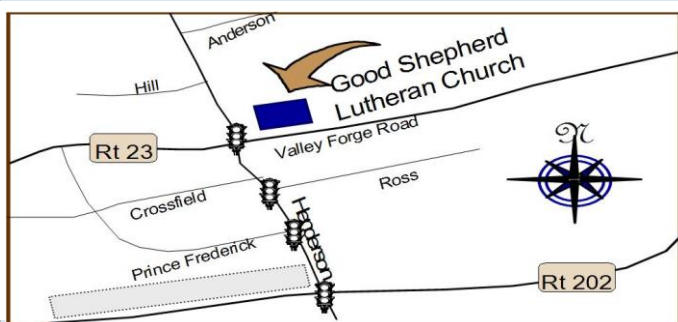
