Meeting Minutes October 19, 2021

WELCOME: Deb Graves welcomed the members that are seeing the meeting on Zoom.

LOST AND FOUND: Jacque Paltrinieri has blue handled scissors from the last workshop. Let her know if they are yours. If you are missing something or find something that is not yours, let someone know so it can get back to the right person.

REFRESHMENTS: The snack sign-up list was passed around. Please remember to bring prepackaged or individually wrapped food.

LIBRARY: We have 26 new books in our library to be checked out.

MEMBERSHIP: Connie Stevenson updated us on membership. Two new members joined in September. Currently we have a membership of 93. Fifteen people still owe dues. Connie had membership cards available at the meeting and will mail cards to those who don't attend in person. She requested that we check the list she sent out for accuracy and she will send out an updated list soon. She introduced the plan to create a photo directory and will be in contact with members requesting a photo head shot in November. Members suggested taking photos at the next meeting.

COMFORT QUILTS: Maxine received 16 quilts in September for a total of 133 for the year. They are donated to the VA in Coatsville, Paoli Hospital for the in-house hospice patients, and St Christopher's Hospital for Children. Abramson Cancer Center and CHOP are not receiving them at this time at their request because of Covid.

WORKSHOPS: Workshops were introduced by Cathy Fennell. There will be an Accuquilt Workshop Saturday, **October 23.** Cathy Fennell encouraged members to sign up and attend. Cathy, along with Maxine Close, Charlene Hagerty, and Beth Mancini, showed us examples of items that they made using the Accuquilt dies.

There will be a Zoom UFO workshop on **November 20**. This is the week before Thanksgiving and will be a great time to get together for socialization and to get some sewing done without having to pack up machine and supplies.

There will be an in-person Dignity Bibs workshop on **December 4** at Good Shepherd from 9:30-3:00. Linda Mitchell will be leading the workshop and is currently working on the best design for our project. Linda said men's shirts of various sizes are needed. They must button down the front, be collared, lightly used without stains, and have a yoke on the back of the shirt. Flannel shirts are good too if they meet the requirements. No knit shirts.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: • Deb communicated that we are looking for a member to be our Accuquilt coordinator. The role includes purchasing dies and keeping inventory of the equipment locations.

• Deb expressed gratitude to the snack committee and guild members and to Rita Mack for volunteering to join the committee.

• There are opportunities to start additional bees if someone is interested in taking that on.

PROGRAM: Karen Glasthal introduced Gail Kessler as owner of Ladyfingers Sewing Studio and fabric designer of the "Dimples" line. She encouraged us to visit the store. Gail gave an introduction to Accuquilt products and helpful tips for its use along with samples of items made using the Accuquilt for cutting. She says that it speeds up her cutting process by 80%. Gail encouraged us to look up Ladyfingers Sewing on YouTube for helpful videos especially the Eastern PA Shop Hop videos to see how dies can be used for various designs. Door prizes were given. Snack time followed the program.

Dignity Bib Workshop with Linda Mitchell





Thanks to these adult bibs, these adults can eat in public without the shame and people around them won't even notice it's actually a bib.


