WELCOME: Deb welcomed everyone including our guest, Silvia Hibrom, and a new member, Denise Pokorny. Eight members watched through Zoom.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- We began the meeting with the ice cream social.
- Linda Jarosz and Joan Shaw won the door prizes.

BLOCK of the MONTH: Beth presented the August Friendship Ribbon block for the 2023 Block of the Month Mystery saying it was quick and easy. Karen Glasthal won the drawing for bringing in her finished July block.

CHALLENGE: Deb asked how many people planned to enter a quilt in the September Challenge. About twelve people responded. She encouraged others to join in and make one. (See the website under Projects for details.)

MEMBERSHIP: Connie is collecting dues in the July and August guild meetings. Others can mail her a check.

COMFORT QUILTS: Maxine received 22 quilts for June with a total of 89. She encouraged people to attend the workshop on Saturday. Maxine reminded us that kits were available this evening.

• Linda Mitchell told us that she we have made 30 dignity bibs to donate to the Veterans Home this year. There will be another workshop in December. Please hang on to any shirts you were planning to donate to her. She has plenty for now.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Babette gave the quarterly financial update. She reminded us that we have a fiscal year that runs from September 1 to August 31. The 2022 Quilt Show revenue is included in this fiscal year.

WORKSHOPS: Cathy Fennell spoke about upcoming workshops.

- July 22 will be a Comfort Quilt workshop.
- The August 19 UFO workshop will include a demonstration of how to make drawstring backpacks by Joan Gunder. Directions will be given when you sign up so that you can cut fabric ahead of time. The Guild will provide the string. This event is free.
- September 23 will be the Downton Abbey themed tea hosted by Cathy Fennell and Molly Lorenz. Wear your fancy hats and gloves and bring your teacup. There will be two projects to make.
- October 21 is our yard sale and craft boutique. \$10 per table. Cathy Fennell is taking reservations.. **BEES:** Deb reminded us that there are 3-4 bees each month. Some are on Zoom. The Thursday Evening Bee is in person and some ladies get together for dinner before the meeting.

THE 2022-2023 CHALLENGE IS UP TO YOU!

THERE IS STILL TIME FOR YOUR PARTICIPATION IN THE "PINK, WEATHER, SHAPE (pentagon, octagon, hexagon) CHALLENGE!

The challenge is "Pink, Weather, Shapes" (Octagon, pentagon, or hexagon)! Some hints for you: Do something small! When thinking about weather, let your 5 senses help you! Remember that your shapes can be "irregular" shapes, i.e., simple houses are pentagons, but the sides are not all the same. Pink must be seen somewhere, but it does not need to be a prominent color.

Bring your quilt by 6:30 pm to the September meeting. It must be in a paper bag. There should be no name on the quilt, or the name must be covered with tape. A short paragraph must accompany the quilt and be attached to it.




