BLOCK of the MONTH: Beth presented the next block for the 2023 Block of the Month Mystery. Carol Mellom won the drawing for the block of the month's participants.

MEMBERSHIP: Membership dues are still \$35. Dues are due! If you haven't paid yet, please mail a check to Karen by September.

COMFORT QUILTS: Linda Newpher shared that 18 quilts were donated last month plus 7 during the workshop for a total of 114 for the year. 18 dolls were made at the workshop and Linda made 22 more for 70 total.

WORKSHOPS: Current workshops were presented by Cathy Fennell.

- August 19 workshop will be a UFO on Zoom, but the backpack demo will be rescheduled.
- September Friendship Tea (Cathy and Molly) has a Downton Abbey theme. It is a UFO time with demos, and prizes.




