The November program features Gretchen Gibbons. She is an avid quilter, designer, teacher, and author who will share her quilting journey with us.

<u>Getting Ready for the Accuquilt</u> <u>Workshop in November</u>

You have a wonderful, creative opportunity to use the guild's Studio dies and the Go! and Go Big! dies members will bring in for you to use. You can look to see what Studio dies are available on our website. Members are bringing many that you can use for applique. If you want to use these, bring your fabric with fusible already ironed on. These dies include sea life, umbrella, butterfly, autumn leaves, snowflakes, mini-Christmas stocking, pig, cow, chicken, bird house, and a holiday medley (tree, holly, snowflakes). There will be a teapot, teacup, and Sun Bonnet Sue. A penguin, owl, and gnome could also be ornaments. There will be large and small bowl cozy dies. Warning: All fabrics, thread and batting should be 100% cotton if cozy will be used in a microwave. Using material with other fibers can cause a fire in your microwave during use. Check labels carefully. There are specific brands of batting designed for this use also. You can make a baby bib with two fabrics and optional batting. When you go on the Accuquilt web site ,(www.accuguilt.com), you can get an idea of sizes to help figure out how much fabric is needed. Allow a good 1/4" around the die in your figuring. Look at all the ways you can use the jar die that will be available. We hope you will be inspired to make things for yourself or for gifts.

In November, she will provide the instructions for assembling the quilt top which should be completed and brought to the December meeting. Marcy Mancini won the Block of the Month drawing. MEMBERSHIP: Karen Glasthal introduced our new member, Mary Pat Smith. Membership dues were due in September. Please see Karen Glasthal.

COMFORT QUILTS: Maxine Close said there were 10 quilts collected in August, making for a total of 124 quilts so far this year. Maxine Close read a lovely thank you note received from a Paoli Hospital hospice patient's family member.

WORKSHOPS: Current workshops were presented by Cathy Fennell.

PROGRAM: The program for this month was the 2023 Challenge. Quilted items were required to use the color pink, include a polygon (hexagon, octagon, etc.), and weather. There were 12 participants for this year's challenge. The voting was completed via secret ballot during the refreshments break. The ballots were counted during the break including votes from members on Zoom. Before the results were presented, each participant spoke about their creation. The results: 1st place: Deb Graves, 2nd place: Linda Mitchell, and 3rd place: Marcy Mancini.

The 2024 Challenge was revealed, "Be's to Live By." Each participant is to choose a slip from the envelope with different phrases. As an example, "Be thoughtful," "Be bubbly," "Be caring," etc. A quilt should be created relating to the "Be" phrase on the slip of paper, using any technique, but must measure 16" by 20." We will present and vote on the challenge quilts at the September 2024 meeting. More information to follow. For any questions, please contact Sandy Dounce. 

VFHQ 2024 Challenge is "Be's to Live By"

6. Completed quilts will be displayed and voted on at the September 2024 meeting and must include a short paragraph about the quilt.






