Minutes from October 17, 2023 Meeting

Announcements: Linda Mitchell welcomed all members in person and on Zoom. This month there was one new member and two guests. The new member is Anita Bennett. Membership dues were due in September. Please see Karen Glasthal if you have not paid your \$35.00 dues. Linda announced that the position of Historian was filled by April Hostler. The Friendship Tea was a big success with 24 attendees including four new members. Two new hostesses are needed for next year.

Karen Glasthal spoke about Quilts of Valor. Several members created a QOV quilt that will be awarded to a veteran by the name of Kiti Williams during the Valley Forge Chorale Fundraiser. The event takes place on Veterans Day at the Lower Providence Presbyterian Church at 2:00 p.m.

Our Treasurer, Kathie Haney, shared the current balance of the guild's funds. Anyone who needs reimbursement, please see Kathie.

Sandy Dounce spoke about the 2023-2024 challenge, "Be's to Live By." Each participant is to choose a slip from the envelope with different phrases. A quilt should be created relating to the "Be" phrase on the slip of paper, using any technique, but must measure 16" by 20." We will present and vote on the challenge quilts at the September 2024 meeting. For any questions, please contact Sandy Dounce.

BOM: Beth Mancini presented the new block of the month for November. At the November meeting, she will share several examples of the completed quilt and provide the instructions for assembling the quilt top which should be completed and brought to the December meeting. Charlene Hagerty won the Block of the Month drawing.

Comfort Quilts: Maxine Close mentioned that there were 14 quilts collected in September, making for a total of 138 quilts so far this year. There were also 44 dolls collected, making for a total of 92 this year.

Workshops: The October 21 yard sale and craft boutique will be from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. Set-up begins at 7:30 a.m. The fee is \$10.00, and all proceeds are your own. November 18 is no longer the Accuquilt workshop. The Accuquilt workshop has been changed to December 2, 2023, and the Dignity Bib workshop has been rescheduled. The January workshop will be on Saturday, January 20, and will include both dignity bibs and comfort quilts.

Drawings: Janet Gaboury won the 50/50 drawing. Mary Pat Smith and Debbie Bianco won the door prizes.

Committee Interview: Rita Mack interviewed Maxine Close who is the chair of the Comfort Quilts Committee. Maxine described how she learned to quilt and mentioned that she has led the comfort quilts committee since 2013. Her duties often include adding quilt labels, washing comfort quilts as needed, delivering the quilts to multiple organizations, organizing and hosting meetings with the comfort quilts team to sort fabric, cut and create kits, and sort the comfort quilts for each organization. Maxine reminded the members that we provide comfort quilts to the Coatesville VA, Einstein NICU, St. Christopher's, and Paoli Hospital.

Conquer Tangled Threads

A recent discussion on our guild's Facebook page led to the sharing of some great tips on how to avoid tangled threads along the edges of fabric when pre-washing fabrics. While many modern fabrics don't have problems with bleeding or shrinking, they can be checked for bleeding by washing in the sink and testing with a small piece of white fabric. If you do choose to pre-wash, smaller pieces can be put into a laundry bag or safety-pinned together on one or two corners. Another method to reduce the fraying is to clip small triangles off the corners of the pieces of fabric. For the more patient among us, pinking the edges or finishing them with a serger or zigzag stitch will go a long way towards avoiding this issue.


