## Minutes from November 21, 2023 Meeting

**Announcements:** Linda Mitchell welcomed all members in person and on Zoom. One new member has joined the guild, Tracy Klinger.

**Spring Retreat:** Barbara Hughes announced that the dates for the Spring Retreat are April 4, 2024, through April 7, 2024, at Black Rock Retreat. The venue is able to accommodate a minimum of 10 members, with a maximum of 25. There are both 2-night and 3-night options, with 1, 2, or 3 members per room. If you are interested, please sign up with Barbara. A \$50 deposit is due at the December 2023 meeting.

Holiday Party: Rita Mack spoke about the plans for the Holiday Party that takes place during the December meeting. The event will start at 6:00 p.m. It will be an in-person meeting only, no Zoom. Members randomly chose food assignments by pulling a slip from a bag at the November meeting. Please create a 5 by 5 Bingo card for the meeting, using 2 ½" squares of various fabrics. There will be prizes given out for "ugliest holiday outfit" as well as "most unique holiday outfit." If you choose to participate, bring a wrapped quilting item, with a value of approximately \$20.00, to participate in the gift exchange.

**BOM**: Beth Mancini presented several examples of the completed Mystery quilt and provided the instructions for assembling the quilt top which should be completed and brought to the December meeting. Laura Chaplar won the Block of the Month drawing.

**Comfort Quilts:** Maxine Close mentioned that there were 19 quilts collected since the last meeting, making for a total of 157 quilts so far this year. She is hoping that the guild will reach over 200 completed comfort quilts by the end of the year.

**Workshops:** Cathy Fennell spoke about the October 21 yard sale and craft boutique. There were 21 total tables, including two tables for the guild, resulting in \$190 profit for the guild. The two guild tables made \$205 from sales, which will go back into the workshop fund to help keep the cost of workshops low. Joan Markowitz won the Fat Quarter raffle. Cathy estimated that there were about 100-150 attendees at the yard sale this year.

The Accuquilt workshop will be held on December 2, 2023. There is no cost to the members. Please see the weekly guild emails for the Signup Genius link, and the newsletter for additional information. The January workshop will be on Saturday, January 20, and will include both dignity bibs and comfort quilts.

**Drawings:** Our new member, Tracy Klinger, won the 50/50 drawing. Kayleigh Graff and Dawn Heefner won the door prizes.

**Committee Interview:** Rita Mack interviewed Judy Snook who is co-chair of the Member Comfort Committee. Judy described her personal history with quilting and detailed how much the Member Comfort Committee means to her. She and Rosemary Geisler provide quilts to members who are seriously ill and who may need some comfort during a difficult time. Judy is an avid quilter who has been quilting for over 30 years since her granddaughter was born. She estimated that she has personally created over 200 quilts.

**Program:** The guest speaker this month was Gretchen Gibbons. She is a quilter, designer, teacher, and author. She detailed how she started working in a quilt shop in 1994, and four short years later, she published her first quilting book. She has had numerous designs published in books, magazines, and calendars, and has even taught classes on a Quilting Cruise. Gretchen comes from a long line of quilters and shared many quilts created by multiple generations in her family, including a quilt created by her great-great-grandmother in the 1860's. She was very knowledgeable regarding the history of quilting and walked us through the changing quilt styles over the decades. Gretchen presented numerous exquisite quilts, including several that were very old, and many with very intricate applique.


