Pottstown Sewing, your "Sew" Happy Place, is located at 142 Shoemaker Road in Pottstown, not too far off route 422. While it is owned by Steve Chubin of Steve's Sew and Vac, it is managed by Liz Bedell. The phone number is 610-326-5055. The website is Pottstownsewing.com. They don't yet have an online store, but they are on Facebook, Instagram and YouTube.

Don't forget to ask for your discount when you shop there as they give 10% off to guild members. Take your membership card in case you need to show it. The staff members are friendly and love to help customers pick out fabrics for their projects. Pottstown Sewing carries a large selection of bright and traditional fabrics. Also check out their selection of blenders. Staff are knowledgeable in many sewing and crafting disciplines. Plus, you can find some yarn and other needle craft supplies in the store.

In addition to being a BabyLock sewing machine dealer, Pottstown Sewing also sells Miele and Riccar vacuums. They have a trained sewing machine repair technician on site and service all makes of machines. Coming in 2024 will be longarm quilting services if all goes according to plan.

Along with the usual variety of quilting and sewing classes, they offer crocheting and knitting, machine embroidery playdates, open sewing times and digitizing and computer classes. Homeschooler classes are also available.

Look for weekly specials in their advertising and visit Pottstown Sewing during Row by Row and Mystery Shop Hop events.








